Abstract The urban regeneration is one of the primary issues in the decades to come. Its success requires active and balanced partnerships between development and conservation, taking into account the appropriate community consultation. Such partnerships should include an evaluation of the urban change processes going on and their environmental, visual, social and economic impact. The short term character of political mandates and decision-making contrasts with the long term effects of politically attractive and technically feasible iconic projects on their urban context. A star architect famously said: "I spit on the context".

Such partnerships and their training component are an essential principle for consideration if historic cities are to continue an inclusive economic, social and cultural development.

Towards sustainable urbanization in Germany and Austria

Abstract

Reshaping and rebuilding our cities is a key challenge of the 21st century, the 'Urban Age'. The conversion of industrial and military infrastructure buildings has become commonplace in cities. The conversion of the existing building stock is an ecologic challenge (saving resources and energy), also an economic challenge (starting a recycling economy) and a social challenge (preserving social milieus). The Federal Ministry for City Development invited curators from all important German environmental, social, economic and scientific institutions to advise the National Urban Development policy, based on the European Leipzig Charter (2007). Messages resulting from the debates include:

- Urban renewal in regard of climate change,
- Mixed uses in the city mobility without fuel,
- Social and cultural cohesion against polarization,
- Integration of economy in the city.
- Cooperation of government and universities,
- Networking cities regional cooperation,
- 'Baukultur' as national integrative, value oriented approach!

Local projects offer specific experiences, such as Hamburg's new HafenCity, and especially its International Building Exhibition 2013 'Brownfields to Greenfields' in industrial regions, and the re-urbanisation of inner cities such as Munich.
